PENALTY RANGE

FORFEITURE: \$150-\$300 Minimum and maximum forfeiture is doubled if there was a minor passenger under 16 [§346.65(2)(f)1]. The offense is a crime and penalties for a 2nd offense apply.

REVOCACTION: 6-9 months.

IGNITION INTERLOCK: Required if PAC .15 or more and \$50 surcharge included in tables below for .15 or more. Length 1 year.

ADDITIONAL OWI PENALTIES AND MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

ALCOHOL ASSESSMENT:

The Court shall order the person to submit to and comply with an assessment by an approved public treatment facility for examination of the person's alcohol, controlled substances or controlled substance analogs and development of a driver safety plan for the person [§343.30(1q)(c)]. If the Court finds that the person is already covered by an assessment or is participating in a driver safety plan or has evidence presented to it by a Court Department under §51.42 that the person has recently completed assessment, a driver safety plan or both, the Court is not required to make such an order. [§343.30(1q)(e)].

Court may order a reduction in court costs, fine or forfeiture to allow the offender to pay the difference for an alcohol assessment and driver safety plan [§346.65(2e)].

Court may order community service to reduce the amount of a fine or forfeiture [§346.65(2g)], or may order community service that demonstrates the adverse effects of substance abuse or driving under the influence, and may order a site visit that demonstrates the effects of substance abuse [§346.65(2g), §346.65(2i)].

Court may also order restitution [§346.65(2r)(a)].

COUNTY OFFERING REDUCED MINIMUM PERIOD OF IMPRISONMENT FOR SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF PROBATION INCLUDING ALCOHOL AND DRUG TREATMENT (Safe Streets Option)

In any county offering reduced minimum periods of imprisonment for successful completion of probation including Alcohol and Drug Treatment, the period of imprisonment shall be not be less than 5 nor more than 7 days for a second offense (§346.65(2)(bm)), not less than 14 days for a 3rd offense (§346.65(2)(cm)) and not less than 29 days for a 4th Offense (§346.65(2)(dm)).

A person may be sentenced only once in his or her lifetime under these provisions.

Ignition Interlock Devices (IIDS)

Ignition Interlock Devices (IIDS) are mandatory on

- 1.All repeat OWI's.
- 2.All refusals.
- 3.All 1st Offense OWI's with a PAC .15 or higher.

IID requirement must be imposed for each motor vehicle for which person's name appears on title or registration (§343.301(1g)(am)1). (Except if equipping such vehicle would cause an undue hardship, court may order 1 or more vehicles not be equipped (§343.301(1m)).

Length of IID Requirement

Minimum: 1 year

Maximum: The maximum period of revocation plus actual imprisonment. IID requirement begins upon date DOT issues the offender a license. The court may order the immediate installation upon entry of order for installation (§343.301(2m)(a)).

MITIGATING AND AGGRAVATING FACTORS IN SENTENCING

MITIGATING FACTORS:

- *Age of prior OWI/BAC Offense/Conviction
- *Pre-conviction Assessment and Treatment
- *Good Driving Record; *Minimal Poor Driving
- *Cooperation with Authorities; *Positive Attitude/Steps Toward Problem Recognition

AGGRAVATING FACTORS:

- *Poor Driving; *Accident or Injury Involved; *Poor Prior Driving Record; *Lack of Remorse
- *Recent Prior OWI/BAC Offense/Conviction
- *Operating Without Valid Driving Privileges (i.e. OAR, OAS, OWL, HTO)
- *Circumstances of Consumption (Binge Drinking, Amount Consumed, Medication, Use, etc.)
- *Poor/Limited Problem Recognition as Evidenced by Prior Treatment History or Lack Thereof
- *Uncooperative/Belligerent/Violent Toward Arresting Officer
- *Prior Uncounted Offenses for OWI/BAC
- *Previously Uncounted Offenses from January 1, 1988
- *Combination of alcohol and controlled substance use

HUBER RELEASE PROVISIONS

The Sheriff may not release a person from jail on Huber if the person fails to obtain assessment or to comply with driver safety plan. (Doesn't apply if prisoner doesn't have sufficient funds to make payments necessary for assessment or to comply with driver safety plan.)(§303.08(10m).

The Sheriff may not release the person from jail or Huber if IID order exists unless within two (2) weeks the court issues the order the person submits proof to the Sheriff that an IID has been installed in each vehicle. (§303.08(10r).

May not stay execution of imprisonment on a 3rd or subsequent offense. (§937.15(8)(a)3).

Bail is revoked upon conviction for a 3rd or subsequent offense. (§969.01(2)(a).

Any person convicted of 2nd or subsequent offense must serve at least 48 consecutive hours in the county jail. (§346.65(7)).
