Purpose of Form:	To request that a child or expectant mother be taken into temporary physical custody in a Chapter 48 proceeding and to record the decision of the juvenile intake worker concerning the custody decision.
Who Completes It:	Intake Worker
Distribution of Form:	Court, Child's Guardian ad Litem/Adversary Counsel, Parents, Parents' Attorney(s), Child's Guardian/Legal Custodian, District Attorney/Corporation Counsel and Caseworker.
Accompanying Forms:	The Temporary Physical Custody Request Supplement (Chapter 48) form (JC-1609) is available to use with JC-1608 form, but it is not required.

Comments:	<p>The legal status categories are defined as follows:</p> <p>Birth – Parent who physically delivered the child.</p> <p>Adoptive – Parent who adopted the child by court order.</p> <p>Adjudicated - Parent based on a court order establishing paternity or parentage or who is the administratively adjudicated parent due to the filing of a paternity acknowledgement form with the Office of Vital Records.</p> <p>Marital – Parent who is presumed to be the biological parent because the child was conceived or born during marriage, or is presumed to be the biological parent because the marriage occurred after the child's birth but the parties had a relationship at the time of conception.</p> <p>NOTE: The marital presumption does <u>not</u> apply if a court has found another person to be the parent instead of this parent. It also doesn't apply if the marriage followed the birth but the child was conceived or born during a marriage to another.</p> <p>For temporary physical custody requests in a Chapter 938 proceeding, use circuit court form JD-1710 form.</p>
