<b>Comments:</b>	<p>2013 WI Act 322, added “The respondent avoid contacting the petitioner and causing any person other than a party’s attorney or law enforcement officer to contact the petitioner unless the petitioner consents in writing.”</p> <p>There is no filing fee if the form of harassment is the type of behavior noted under (a) of the new definition of harassment. There is a filing fee if the form of harassment is the type of behavior noted under (b) of the new definition of harassment. Can be used in juvenile proceedings. Orders now can remain in effect for four years.</p> <p>The order can only enjoin conduct, or substantially similar conduct, which forms the finding of harassment. <i>Bachowski v. Salamone</i>, 139 Wis. 2d 397, 414 (1987).</p>
