<b>Purpose of Form:</b>	Authorizes a treatment provider to involuntarily administer medications (including psychotropic medications) and treatment to a subject.
<b>Who Completes It:</b>	The Committee anticipates this form can be completed in court by checking the appropriate box.
<b>Who Signs It:</b>	<b>BY THE COURT:</b> Circuit Court Judge/Circuit Court Commissioner.
<b>Distribution of Form:</b>	Court; copies to parties, counsel and treatment providers.
<b>Accompanying Forms:</b>	Generally this form will be attached to an order of detention after a finding of probable cause, or an order for commitment.
<b>New Form/Modification:</b>	Modified; last update 05/19.
<b>Modifications:</b>	Added "at or" after hearing.
<b>Comments:</b>	<p>The following comments are retained from the previous form summary: The court can enter an order allowing a treatment provider to administer involuntary medication or treatment to a subject after a finding of probable cause, at a final commitment hearing, or upon a separate post-commitment petition and hearing.</p> <p>If the order is entered following a finding of probable cause, the order is in effect only until the final hearing. Otherwise, the order would be in effect until the commitment expires or the order is vacated.</p>
