## TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

This matter coming before the Court pursuant to Plaintiff's motion for a temporary restraining order and preliminary injunctive relief, and the Court being fully advised in the premises,

## THE COURT HEREBY FINDS THAT:

- 1. Plaintiff Wells Fargo Clearing Services, LLC ("Wells Fargo" or the "Company") has a reasonable likelihood of success with regard to its claims for breach of contract, breach of fiduciary duty and misappropriation of trade secrets against Defendant Glen J. Webster ("Webster").
- 2. Wells Fargo has demonstrated there is not a legal remedy at law and Wells Fargo is being irreparably harmed by Webster's actions because the client relationships will be irretrievably harmed and confidential information will be lost.
- 3. A temporary injunction is necessary to preserve the status quo until Wells Fargo's request for a permanent injunction can be considered. Absent a temporary injunction, Wells

Fargo's customers and proprietary information will likely be lost and the entry of a permanent injunction will therefore be futile.

WHEREFORE, THE COURT ORDERS:

A. Webster, as well as his agents, servants, employees, and anyone in active concert or participation with Webster or his agents, servants or employees, are hereby enjoined from using, disclosing, or transmitting information obtained by Webster from Wells Fargo pertaining to the identity of the Company's clients or their addresses, telephone numbers, email addresses, accounts, account numbers, financial portfolios or investment objectives.

B. Webster, as well as his agents, servants, employees, and anyone in active concert or participation with Webster or his agents, servants or employees, are prohibited from soliciting or attempting to solicit any Wells Fargo client that Webster serviced for the Company during his final year of employment for the Company. For the purposes of this Order, soliciting shall mean that Webster shall not initiate any contact with any Wells Fargo client, but he shall be permitted to communicate with any Wells Fargo client that initiates contact with him.

C. The injunctions set forth above in paragraphs A and B shall expire at midnight on December 1, 2018, which is fifteen days from the effective date of this Temporary Restraining Order.
