2015AP1448-CRNM State of Wisconsin v. Lafayette L. Fairconatue (L.C. #2013CF1304)

Before Curley, P.J.

By prior order, this court directed Attorney Thomas J. Erickson, appellate counsel for Lafayette L. Fairconatue, to file a supplemental no-merit report in this matter. Attorney Erickson now seeks voluntary dismissal of the no-merit appeal and moves to extend Fairconatue's postconviction and appellate deadlines. The court infers that counsel has concluded the case presents an arguably meritorious issue. A no-merit proceeding is appropriate only if counsel is convinced that an appeal would be wholly frivolous. *McCoy v. Court of Appeals*, 486 U.S. 429, 437 (1988). Moreover, an appellant has a right to voluntarily dismiss his or her appeal prior to

disposition. See State v. Lee, 197 Wis. 2d 959, 962, 542 N.W.2d 143 (1996). Accordingly, the

court will grant the relief requested. Fairconatue does not state the length of the extension he

requires. The court will allow an appropriate extension that accommodates this court's

procedures at remittitur.

IT IS ORDERED that the no-merit report is rejected and this appeal is dismissed without

prejudice.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the deadline for filing a postconviction motion or

notice of appeal in this matter is extended through March 7, 2016. See WIS. STAT. RULE

809.82(2)(a) (2013-14).
