2018AP2320-CRNM State of Wisconsin v. Michael S. Huebsch (L.C. # 2016CF330)

Before Fitzpatrick, P.J., Blanchard, and Nashold, JJ.

Summary disposition orders may not be cited in any court of this state as precedent or authority, except for the limited purposes specified in WIS. STAT. RULE 809.23(3).

Attorney Mark Thompson, appointed counsel for Michael Huebsch, has filed a no-merit report pursuant to Wis. Stat. Rule 809.32 (2017-18)¹ and *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738

(1967). Counsel provided Huebsch with a copy of the report, and both counsel and this court advised him of his right to file a response. Huebsch has not responded. We conclude that this case is appropriate for summary disposition. *See* WIS. STAT. RULE 809.21. After our independent review of the record, we conclude there is no arguable merit to any issue that could be raised on appeal.

Huebsch pled no contest to one count of second-degree sexual assault of a child. The court imposed a sentence of twelve years of initial confinement and seven years of extended supervision.

The no-merit report addresses whether Huebsch's plea was entered knowingly, voluntarily, and intelligently. The plea colloquy sufficiently complied with the requirements of *State v. Brown*, 2006 WI 100, ¶35, 293 Wis. 2d 594, 716 N.W.2d 906, and WIS. STAT. § 971.08, relating to the nature of the charge, the rights Huebsch was waiving, and other matters. The record shows no other ground to withdraw the plea. There is no arguable merit to this issue.

The no-merit report addresses whether the court erroneously exercised its sentencing discretion. The standards for the circuit court and this court on sentencing issues are well established and need not be repeated here. *See State v. Gallion*, 2004 WI 42, ¶¶17-51, 270 Wis. 2d 535, 678 N.W.2d 197. In this case, the court considered appropriate factors, did not consider improper factors, and reached a reasonable result. There is no arguable merit to this issue.

Our review of the record discloses no other potential issues for appeal.

Therefore,

No. 2018AP2320-CRNM

IT IS ORDERED that the judgment of conviction is summarily affirmed. *See* WIS. STAT. RULE 809.21.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Attorney Thompson is relieved of further representation of Huebsch in this matter. *See* WIS. STAT. RULE 809.32(3).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this summary disposition order will not be published.
