State of Wisconsin v. Terence Charles Mack (L.C. # 2010CF2932)

Before Brash, P.J., Dugan and White, JJ.

Summary disposition orders may not be cited in any court of this state as precedent or authority, except for the limited purposes specified in WIS. STAT. RULE 809.23(3).

Terrance Charles Mack, *pro se*, appeals the circuit court's order denying his postconviction motion for sentence modification. He argues that his sentence should be modified due to the dangers the COVID-19 pandemic presents to him as an incarcerated inmate with health problems.

After reviewing the briefs and record, we conclude that summary disposition is appropriate. *See* WIS. STAT. RULE 809.21(2019-20).¹ Upon review, we affirm.

The issue Mack raises is moot because he has been released from prison. “An issue is moot when its resolution will have no practical effect on the underlying controversy.” *State ex rel. Olson v. Litscher*, 2000 WI App 61, ¶3, 233 Wis. 2d 685, 608 N.W.2d 425. Mack has been released from prison, so he has already received the relief he sought. The general rule is that we will not consider issues that are moot, and we see no reason to deviate from that general rule here. *See id.*

Upon the foregoing,

IT IS ORDERED that the order of the circuit court is summarily affirmed. *See* WIS. STAT. RULE 809.21.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this summary disposition order will not be published.
