Name of Form:	Petition for Temporary Restraining Order and/or Petition and Motion for Injunction Hearing (Child Abuse – 30710)

Purpose of Form:	To petition the court for an order to restrain someone from committing child abuse and to schedule a hearing on an injunction.
Who Completes It:	Party who is seeking the restraining order.
Distribution of Form:	Original to court, copies to petitioner and to respondent (by service), and law enforcement.
Accompanying Forms:	Documents submitted to the court in support of the petition, plus a prepared copy of a Temporary Restraining Order for signing by the judge or court commissioner. If a respondent is the parent or legal guardian of the child or has court-ordered visitation with the child, the petitioner must complete the UCCJEA GF-150 form.
New Form/Modification:	Modified; last update 09/24.
Modifications:	Removed references to affidavit as part of 23 Wis Act 245 (unsworn declaration).
Comments:	2013 WI Act 311, added extension of injunction language; added UCCJEA affidavit language.
	<p>There are two sets of forms for child abuse injunctions—a juvenile court set (JC-1690 to JC-1692) and civil court set (CV-412 to CV-414). The civil court set, with the documents filed with the clerk of court, are used in all cases unless one of the following two exceptions exist:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The respondent is a child; or2. There is a pending CHIPS action in the juvenile court involving the child victim.
	<p>There is no filing fee in any child abuse action filed in adult or juvenile court in compliance with Act 272.</p>
