Name of Form:	Plea Questionnaire/Waiver of Rights (CHIPS and JIPS)

Purpose of Form:	To provide a standard format for a child, juvenile, parent, guardian, legal custodian, or Indian custodian to complete to enter an admission or no contest plea in a child in need of protection or services (CHIPS) or juvenile in need of protection or services (JIPS) case.
Who Completes It:	The person entering the plea, with the assistance of his or her attorney (if represented by an attorney).
Distribution of Form:	Original is filed with the court.
Accompanying Forms:	Generally none, although additional documentation may be needed. For example: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Complex plea agreements may be in writing;• Specific conditions of supervision may be too long to fit in the space provided;• The elements of the ground(s) may be spelled out in greater detail than is available in the space provided;• Answers to some questions may require further explanation.
New Form/Modification:	New Form
Modifications:	Created a new form for CHIPS and JIPS cases. For delinquency cases, use JD-1737.
Comments:	Adult criminal courts and some juvenile courts have utilized written plea questionnaire forms for several years. The plea questionnaire does not eliminate the need for a personal colloquy between the court official and the juvenile, but it does allow the court a reference that can shorten the plea taking process. It also provides defense counsel with a format to follow to ensure coverage of all relevant issues.
