## No. 2024AP832 <u>Pitsch v. Charter Communications, Inc.</u> L.C.# 2023SC902

On September 6, 2024, plaintiff-appellant-petitioner, Michael Frederick Pitsch, pro se, filed a petition for review and accompanying paper appendix concerning the court of appeals' August 7, 2024 decision in this matter, which the court of appeals declined to reconsider by order of August 23, 2024. With the petition, Mr. Pitsch filed a motion asking this court for permission to file a "digital appendix" consisting of "unrecorded digital files" contained on a USB drive submitted with the motion. The motion explains that the USB drive contains "about 4,000 files, in more than 240 folders and subfolders" that "cover[] more than three years of Charter/Spectrum complaint related documents." Mr. Pitsch claims that this "digital appendix" is necessary because "[t]hose paper documents that were filed, were not done so in a clearly understandable manner, as remarked by the trial judge . . . nor have the digital files been submitted at all."

IT IS ORDERED that the motion is denied. The proposed "digital appendix" does not comply with our rules. <u>See</u> Wis. Stat. 809.62(2)(f) (appendix shall include "portions <u>of the record</u> necessary for an understanding of the petition"). The clerk is directed to return to Mr. Pitsch the USB drive he submitted with his motion.
