On September 9, 2015, Attorneys Michael D. Cicchini and Terry W. Rose filed a rule petition asking this court to amend Supreme Court Rule (SCR) 20:1.9(c) (Duties to former clients), which generally discusses the prohibition of an attorney to use or reveal information relating to a former representation of a client. The petition proposes that the court amend SCR 20:1.9(c) by adding the marked text, as follows:

- (c) A lawyer who has formerly represented a client in a matter or whose present or former firm has formerly represented a client in a matter shall not thereafter do either of the following:
- (1) <u>U</u>se information relating to the representation to the disadvantage of the former client except as these rules would permit or require with respect to a client, or when the information has become generally known. "Generally known" information includes information that is publicly available or has been disclosed in a public forum.
- (2) Reveal information relating to the representation except as these rules would permit or require with respect to a client. Information that is "generally known" has already been revealed.
