The petition was filed in response to this court's order dated December 11, 2009. See S. Ct. Order 09-05, 2009 WI 104 (issued Dec. 11, 2009, eff. Jan. 1, 2010).

The December 11, 2009, order addressed an earlier rule petition filed by the parties regarding the interpretation same SCR 71.02(2) (Required Court Reporting) and directed the Committee of Chief Judges and District Court Administrators to collaborate with appellate practitioners and other interested parties to evaluate whether amendments to Wis. Stat. § 885.42(4) may be warranted. pending petition addresses the court's questions about possible language in § 885.42 by proposing conflicting that videotape depositions continue to be reported and transcribed by the court
