Wisconsin Supreme Court accepts three cases at June 17 conference

Madison, Wisconsin (July 10, 2024) – The Wisconsin Supreme Court recently voted to accept three cases, and the Court acted to deny review in a number of other cases. The case numbers, counties of origin and the issues presented in granted cases are listed below. Oconomowoc Area School District v. Cota

Supreme Court case type: Petition for Review & Cross Petition

Court of Appeals: District II

Circuit Court: Waukesha County, Judge Lloyd V. Carter, reversed and remanded with

directions.

Long caption: Oconomowoc Area School District, Petitioners-Appellant v. Labor and Industry Review Commission, Respondent-Respondent-Petitioner, Jeffrey M. Cota and Gregory L. Cota, Respondents-Respondents-Cross-Petitioners.

Issue(s) presented by Labor and Industry Review Commission:

1. Does information indicating that an individual has been questioned, apprehended, taken into custody or detention, held for investigation, arrested, charged with, indicted or tried pursuant to law enforcement authority, for a municipal offense punishable by forfeiture, constitute an "arrest record"

- within the meaning of [the WFEA] and does the WFEA therefore provide protection against terminations that are based upon this information?
- 2. If the Court agrees on the first issue presented, a secondary issue is presented as to whether substantial evidence in the record supports the factual finding of the [LIRC] that the decision of the Oconomowoc Area School District ("the District") to terminate the employment of Jeffrey Cota and Gregory Cota ("the Cotas") was made on the basis of their arrest records, in violation of the WFEA.

Issue(s) presented by Jeffrey M. Cota and Gregory L. Cota:

1. Did LIRC and the trial court correctly determine that a municipal citation was an arrest record as defined by Wis. Stat. § 111.32(1), and therefore firing the Cotas because of information indicating the Cotas had been issued a municipal citation was arrest record discrimination?

Douglas County v. K.A.D.

Supreme Court case type: Petition for Review

Court of Appeals: District III

Circuit Court: Douglas County, Judge Kelly J. Thimm, *affirmed*.

Long caption: Douglas County, Petitioners-Respondent v. K.A.D., Respondent-Appellant-Petitioner.

Issue(s) presented:

- 1. Should this court overrule [Outagamie County v. L.X.D.-O., 2023 WI App 17, 407 Wis. 2d 441, 991 N.W.1d 518]?
- 2. Whether the County presented sufficient evidence under Wis. Stat. § 51.61(1)(g)4. to establish that K.A.D. was incompetent to refuse medication?

Supreme Court case type: Original Action Petition

Long caption: Jeffery A. LeMieux and David T. DeValk, Petitioners v. Tony Evers, Governor of Wisconsin, Sarah Godlewski, Secretary of State of Wisconsin, and Jill Underly, Wisconsin State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Respondents.

Issue(s) presented:

- 1. Does Article V, § 10(1)(c) of the Wisconsin Constitution forbid a governor from deleting digits in an enrolled bill to create a new year?
- 2. Does a governor exceed his or her partial-veto authority under Article V, § 10(1)(b) of the Wisconsin Constitution by deleting language in an enrolled bill to create a longer duration than the one that the legislature approved?

Review denied: The Supreme Court denied review in the following cases. As the state's law-developing court, the Supreme Court exercises its discretion to select for review only those cases that fit certain <u>statutory criteria</u> (see Wis. Stat. § 809.62).
